Dom Maurice Chauncey was born in Hertfordshire about A. D. 1513. He was educated at Oxford and Grays Inn, and entered the Carthusian Order before he was twenty, and was professed in 1534, Blessed John Houghton being then Prior. During the persecution which followed that Martyrs death, Dom Maurice was zealous in resisting the endeavours of Cromwell to induce

the monks to acknowledge the supremacy of the King, and was one of four who were sent away from the London House into
